

ISA Software Skillnet launches Scala Executive programme to address product management skills gap in Irish software companies

37% of projects fail due to inaccurate requirements gathering

Dublin, Ireland 2 September 2014 – The ISA (Irish Software Association) Software Skillnet announces the launch of a new product management training programme, [Scala Executive](#) in conjunction with the Dublin Institute of Technology.

In 2013, the ISA in partnership with the ISA Software Skillnet conducted research to ascertain the experiences of member company CEOs from a number of software companies. This study, also supported by Enterprise Ireland and its client companies, found a significant need for improved product management skills within Irish software organisations.

“A recent global survey of practitioners established that inaccurate requirements gathering remained a primary cause of project failure in 2014,” said Edel Creely, MD of Trilogy Technologies and Chairperson of the Irish Software Association. “This figure has grown from 32% in 2013 to 37% in 2014. By developing the Scala programme, we want to ensure that executives in Irish technology companies have the relevant skills in order to tackle these constraints and build successful products and services.”

ISA Software Skillnet identified the key areas of interest for executives leading or delivering product management capability and developed a selection of training courses.

Scala Executive, a series of 4 workshops being held in the Radisson Blu Royal Hotel Dublin, commences in September 2014. Each course centres on key product management areas which will help drive revenue growth, increase profitability and shorten the sales process.

“The report also found that 51% of companies don’t have the necessary resources in place to properly perform requirements management,” said John Maguire, S3 Group and chair, ISA Product Management Working Group. “Organisations can slow the trend towards failed projects and lost revenue by developing the skills and processes to elicit and prioritise requirements.”

The first workshop in the series, Discovering Customer Requirements, will be delivered by Ellen Gottesdiener, renowned author and expert in product management. Her most recent book *Discover to Deliver: Agile Product Planning and Analysis* provides the essential planning and analysis practices needed to collaboratively deliver high value products.

Scala Executive programme details

Discovering Customer Requirements – 29 September

This highly interactive course covers how to explore, evaluate and confirm customer requirements to make smart product decisions.

Product Roadmapping – 30 October

Delegates will learn best practice about how to collate and prioritise ideas and then plan and communicate an effective roadmap.

Strategic Pricing – 20 November

How to keep price (and discounts) aligned with objectives. This will cover the pros and cons of different strategies, the issues to look out for and how to set a price for products and services.

Quickstart Product Management – 4 February

The Quickstart workshop helps new and aspiring product managers understand the role so that they can become as productive as possible, as fast as possible.
